	The the fire alarm system and the emergency lights have been replaced at the Public Hall.	
	New benches along Greenway have been installed.	
	Remembrance poppies were purchased and displayed along the High Street in Belton as well as Sandtoft and Beltoft.	
	The villages achieved highly commended in the Best Kept Village competition.	
	New planters were installed in Sandtoft and Beltoft and the Parish Council successfully applied for a grant from N Lincs Council for plants for the villages.	
	The grass cutting contract is working well and residents have commented on the improvement in the footpaths and grass verges.	
	Cllr Baker Cliff advised that the Council will be making some immediate repairs to the Public Hall but following this they are hoping to agree a lease with Belton preschool.	

	A project manager has been instructed to continue progress on the War Memorial refurbishment at Grey Green. The Parish Council are hoping to successfully apply for a grant from the War Memorial Trust and use this along with the budgeted £10,000 to cover the expected costs.
